LISC is offering a 3-day short course to provide you with an understanding of: the importance of data management; the research data lifecycle; and the organisation, documentation and long-term curation of research data.

Funders and institutions in South Africa are encouraging the standardised management of research data.

At the end of the short course, you should be able to:

- write a data management plan
- identify and evaluate appropriate metadata schemas, generate metadata and cite datasets appropriately
- identify and assess the appropriateness of data repositories for particular purposes
- appreciate discipline-specific data management challenges
- understand of the roles, responsibilities and governance in the RDM landscape

Participants will be required to engage in practical group work and discussions related to the content covered. They will have the opportunity to learn from the experiences of one another about the disciplinary differences inherent in the management of research data.
