Metadata and Linked Data

This session will explore lessons learnt in establishing descriptive metadata standards for repositories. Furthermore, the session will provide information about linked data elements within the metadata creation process. Although the current digital content management system approach will be used as the basis for the discussions for this workshop, the lessons and outcomes are intended to inform decisions about communities of practice for research data management systems and applications as well.

Data Visualisation

The "Data Revolution" sparked a renewed interest in data visualisation as a tool to represent the essence of research evidence. Data stewards should therefore raise awareness about opportunities that this may entail, as well as provide guidance in best practices. Developing the skill to visualise data effectively also enables data stewards to communicate their own data-driven information in the best way. The workshop will kick-off with an introductory presentation: "The story behind the numbers - An introduction to data visualisation". This will be followed by a work session where attendees will work with provided summarised data on the use of data sets and will be asked to create their own visualisations according to best practice principles.
