## **GUIDELINES FOR THE SUBMISSIONS**

**Two submissions will be made, the second submission is dependent on the acceptance of the first submission.**

### **1<sup>st</sup> SUBMISSION – THE ABSTRACT**

**The abstract is to be submitted by the 30<sup>th</sup> April 2019;**

#### **Guide to the abstract submission**

- 1. Title of the paper typed in arial font size 11 in caps**
- 2. Full name of the author starting with the title, surname and initials**
- 3. E-mail addresses of the authors or corresponding authors,**
- 4. Authors affiliation [organization]is to be put below the email**
- 5. 250 – 300 words for the abstract excluding key words,**
- 6. Between 4 – 6 key words or phrases under the abstract itself.**

### **2<sup>nd</sup> SUBMISSION – THE MANUSCRIPT**

The second submission is the manuscript latest by the **31<sup>st</sup> July 2019**, for those with accepted abstracts. Following are expectations from the authors by the editor. Take note that the accepted abstract will be part of the manuscript (final submission) as stipulated in the table below.

The length of the paper; 4 500 – 6 000 words

All graphs and tables should be correctly labeled and sources referenced according to the Harvard method. All in text references must have surnames [no initials], year and page numbers for easy cross checking.

**All papers will be subjected to double blinded peer reviewing.**

<b>Ghana</b> 62 years	Formerly Gold Coast [population +- 27 million], 60 yrs independence, 2 <sup>nd</sup> largest gold country – rich in diamonds, bauxite, exports them unprocessed. Doesn't manufacture a pin!!!!!!!!!!!!
<b>Nigeria</b> 59 years	Most populous in Africa [184 million] 7 <sup>th</sup> most populous worldwide, largest oil producer on continent, gold, iron ore, bitumen, uranium, coal, but can't make a needle!!!!!!!!!!!!
<b>DRC</b> 57 years	Formerly Zaire, 57 yrs independence, 68 million, has least developed infrastructure, rich in cobalt, copper, diamond, tantalum, tin, bauxite, gold and exports all minerals, can't a pin.
<b>Zimbabwe</b> 37 years	37 years of independence = Once Africa's bread basket now depends on food aid, world's largest producer of asbestos and tobacco, rich in iron ore, copper, uranium, platinum, tin, zinc 3 <sup>rd</sup> largest gold producer on continent, can't make a drawing pin!!!!!!!!!!!!.
